How many active members does your group/organisation have?

Marie Curie is a national charity organisation.

Who, in the community of Llanharry and Tylagarw benefits from the services offered by your group/organisation?

One in four people do not receive the care and support they need at the end of life and this sadly applies just as much to the residents of Llanharry and Tylagarw.

There is no guarantee that the services which are available to them can meet all their needs. Every pound that Marie Curie can raise is vital to help improve end of life care and give people the vital emotional and practical help they need.

Many patients prefer to receive care in their own homes, from respite visits to the full Marie Curie "hospice at home" service. Both patients and their families (who are currently often the only carers available) benefit from this help, as well as from the support and information telephone helpline.

What are the main activities provided by your group/organisation?

Marie Curie is the UK's leading end of life charity. The charity provides expert end of life care for people with any illness they are likely to die from (not only cancer), and support for their family and friends, both in its hospices and where they live. It is the largest charity funder of palliative and end of life care research in the UK, and campaigns to ensure everyone has a good end of life experience.

Currently, one in four people do not receive the care and support they need at the end of life, and there is no guarantee that services available to them can meet all their needs. Every pound raised is vital to help improve end of life care and give people the vital emotional and practical help they need.

The charity is entirely dependent on fundraising and public donations, including bequests; grants are therefore of inestimable help with funding its work. There are two main fundraising drives each year, the Great Daffodil Appeal and a Christmas Appeal; however, a host of other events are held, such as the Big Summer Quiz, golfing days etc.
